

Texas Water Fund

**Promote Water Conservation**  
Proposition 6 will help repair and replace water infrastructure such as leaky pipes and support conservation awareness.

**Support Sufficient Water Supply During a Drought**  
Proposition 6 will help support the development of new water supplies to meet the needs of our growing population, especially during an extended drought.

**Help Local Communities and the Texas Economy**  
Proposition 6 will help expand water and wastewater infrastructure in local communities to preserve Texas' vibrant economy.

The Texas Water Fund, and the \$1 billion allocated to it by the Legislature in May of 2023, will be on the ballot this November. Texas voters must approve the changes to the state's constitution required to set up the new dedicated source of funding for water infrastructure and new water sources. This funding will be used to replace and upgrade our water utility infrastructure and develop new water resources, both necessary to meet the growth and demands of our state now and in the future. Early voting begins on Monday, October 23, and election day is Tuesday, November 7.
